

This reference document provides all required information to apply for a BCSSA Sanction. Please use the <u>BCSSA Sanction Request Form</u> (online form) to formally apply for a sanction. There are two types of BCSSA sanctions:

National Competition: all chief officials must be minimum Level 3. 	 The following officials must be minimum Level 1: Chief referee or starter Chief timer It is recommended to have certified officials, where possible, to promote the ODC development program and to provide mentorship opportunities. 				
Medical Requirements	All Sanctioned competitions must adhere to the <u>BCSSA Medical Requirements</u> .					
Track Certification	All Sanctioned competitions must be skated on a certified track. The <u>Track Certification Form</u> must be completed.

SSC P&R B4-500 states: "Sanctions must be applied for through the SSC Head Office by way of electronic application available on SSC's website. Only electronic submissions will be accepted." Please note that there are multiple forms to be completed for an SSC sanction; please see the <u>Sanction Applications</u> webpage on the SSC website. SSC no longer charges any fees for an SSC sanction. National Competition medals and helmet covers *must* be ordered directly from Speed Skating Canada.
